Peter E. Geier is Chief Executive Officer of OSU Health System and Chief Operating Officer for Ohio State University Medical Center. In addition, he is Senior Associate Vice President for Health Sciences Business and Administration and Vice President for Health Services and is involved with all areas of the organization's three-part mission of research, education, and patient care. Mr. Geier brings both business acumen and a strong customer service orientation to his position which is critical to helping the organization achieve its goals and fulfill its mission. Prior to joining OSU Medical Center, he was President and Chief Operating Officer for Huntington Bancshares Incorporated. During his 17-year career with Huntington, Mr. Geier held a number of leadership positions in commercial, retail, and investment banking. Prior to joining Huntington, he was a Vice President with Merchants Bank in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Mr. Geier has been active in the Columbus community serving on a number of for-profit and not-for-profit boards, including Huntington Bancshares Incorporated, Prologue International, Inc., Omeris, Children's Hospital, Central Ohio United Way, Columbus School for Girls, Columbus Council on World Affairs, Columbus Area Growth Foundation, COTA, and the Edison Biotechnology Center. He is a member of the Young Presidents' Organization and a past member of Columbus Rotary.

He received a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration from Purdue University and a Masters Degree in Business Administration from Butler University. Mr. Geier is a graduate of The Kellogg Graduate School of Management Advanced Executive Program at Northwestern University and the Stonier Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University.

David E. Schuller is Senior Executive Director of the Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital and Richard J. Solove Research Institute, Deputy Director of the OSU Comprehensive Cancer Center and Medical Director of the OSU Medical Center Campaign.

He is providing leadership for a major expansion of the Medical Center's cancer program which will dramatically increase the physical size of its patient care services and enhance the intellectual environment for accelerating cancer research. This is the largest expansion project ever undertaken by the university. Likewise, as Medical Director of the Power to Change Lives Campaign he is playing a critical in helping the Medical Center meet its goal of raising \$500 million to support mission development across the organization.

Dr. Schuller's academic appointments include being Professor of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. Having led the Department as Chair since 1984, he recently retired this leadership position. He specializes in head and neck surgery and facial plastic and reconstructive surgery and served as an American Cancer Society Professor of Clinical Oncology from 1989-94. His research interests focus in head and neck oncology, the development and progression of this disease, the development of novel therapeutic strategies, and in the evaluation of new surgical approaches for both extirpation and reconstruction. He was appointed to the John W. Wolfe Chair in Cancer Research in 2004. In 2003, he was named a Fellow for the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). Dr. Schuller graduated from Rutgers University (B.A.) in 1966 and from the Ohio State University College of Medicine with honors. He joined the Ohio State University faculty in 1976.
